
## **Eucharistic Conference**

# 50 New Students Join National Honor Society

On Thursday, May 4, Alleman welcomed 50 new members into its National Honor Society chapter. Also recognized were 26 new provisional candidates who will enter NHS membership next year as juniors.

We were honored to welcome home Mr. Robert Noe, Alleman Class of 1959, who was also a member of NHS. He shared how the pillars of Character, Scholarship, Leadership and Service impacted his life. After graduating Alleman, Mr. Noe attended St. Ambrose and later Notre Dame Law School. He has served the Quad Cities for over 50 years in his legal career and in his many volunteer efforts.



### Alleman Football Partners with First Army on Rock Island Arsenal

The Alleman football team and our feeder schools joined forces with the First Army on the Rock Island Arsenal for an afternoon of team building on Monday, May 8th. The coaches wanted to motivate, re-brand, and unite the program with an afternoon modeled after the Army's boot camp. Outgoing Allemen senior Charles Jagusah is taking his talents to South Bend next year, playing for college football powerhouse Notre Dame. He and a few of his older Pioneer teammates guided the underclassmen and junior high schoolers through four different drills.

"We're leading them through these drills and kind of the camaraderie that Alleman has," Jagusah said. "I feel like it'll kind of open their eyes to that because I definitely didn't know about it before I came to Alleman." Before the practice, the kids heard from veterans about their experiences in the military. Once on the island, they received instructions from active personnel through four boot-camp-themed drills; crawling under wires, sled pulling, stretcher carries, and simulated grenade throwing. Recruiters with the Army and representatives with the ROTC at the University of Iowa were also present. The team-building event ended with a 1.2-mile run, chanting in cadence. Army Captain Kyle Merritt said it's important to build these relationships within the community. "You need your squad to work together for that common goal, through adversity, you're going to have an opponent on the other end, that's exactly what football does." Merritt said. "That's exactly what the Army does. So it goes hand in hand, same mission." The program is already seeing increasing numbers. • **Jeff Schmulbach**, Head Football Coach: Since 2013, Coach Schmulbach has been on the Rock Island High School football coaching staff. He also served at Rockridge High School from 2010-2013, at Galva High School from 2005-2009, and at Prophetstown High School from 2001-2005.

• **Scott Morel**, Head Men's Basketball Coach: Coach Morel is an Alleman graduate from the Class of 1992 and has previously served as an assistant coach for the women's basketball program at Black Hawk College and an assistant coach for the men's program at Black Hawk from 1999-2009. Scott was also the Head Football Coach at Highland High School in Riverside, Iowa from 2016-2021.

• **Taylor Love**, Head Men's Golf Coach: Coach Love is a 2009 Alleman graduate. While at Alleman he played all four years for the men's golf team.

• **Thomas Smith**, Head Baseball Coach: Coach Smith is a former Alleman PE/Health Teacher from 2020-2021. He was an assistant coach for the Alleman Baseball program from 2019-2020. ## Alleman Welcomes 67 New Alumni

On Sunday, May 29, 67 graduates crossed the stage of Augustana's Centennial Hall to receive their diplomas and join the long history of Alleman Alumni. Each year, our Alleman students continue to excel in academics and that was demonstrated again by the recognition of our many Illinois State Scholars and members of the National Honor Society.

Members of our ACES team were also recognized. ACES is an academic competition for high school students to compete in Math, English, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Programming, and Engineering Graphics. At Regionals Kate Rector placed 2nd in Math and 3rd in English. Three seniors represented Alleman at the state level contest: Emily Gonzalez, Olivia Gusse, and Liana Tillberg. At state, Liana placed 5th in Computer Science and 6th in English.

Our students in the ICTM academic competition were also honored. Students competed against other high school students as individuals as well as on teams in math contests ranging from Algebra - Precalculus. At regionals the seniors placed 1st in the Precalculus team event. Individually, at Regionals, Kate Rector placed 2nd and Quentin Fonseca placed 3rd. This group of seniors have contributed to a historic five-year run of 1st place finishes at regionals.

Our Alleman Catholic High School students from the Class of 2023 have furthered distinguished Alleman as a respected, College-Preparatory high school in the Quad City Community. This year, we are excited to announce that this class has earned an amazing combined total of over \$6.1 million in scholarship award money.

Our Christian Service Honor Cord was awarded to students at graduation who have shown exemplary commitment of 90 or more service hours over the last four years. The colors of green and white on the cords represent service to our school, parishes, our Alleman families, and our community, and the gold represents their love for Jesus Christ.

Several graduates plan to serve our country in the armed forces. Emma Sottos received her certificate of appointment from the United States Military Academy at West Point and will be attending the service academy this fall. Lincoln Dorsey will be serving in the United States Air Force National Guard and Landyn McMeekan will join the United States Army National Guard. Jared Hernandez has been accepted as a seminarian for the Diocese of Peoria and will be attending Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary of Minnesota this Fall.

The Salutatorian from the Class of 2023 was Katherine (Kate) Rector. She is an Illinois State Scholar and is a member of the National Honor Society. She is also a member of the ACES & ICTM Teams, IHSA All-State Academic Team Nominee, and WB6 All-Academic for the Fall. Her awards include the President's Education Outstanding Academic Excellence, Excellence in Science Awards along with Recognition from Alleman Faculty in Literature, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Spanish. She received acceptances to Texas Christian University, St. Louis University, University of Iowa, Iowa State University, and University of Notre Dame. She received the Moline Foundation D.A.R.E. Scholarship along with being offered St. Louis University SLU Higher Purpose, SLU Vice President Tuition Scholarships, and SLU Catholic High School Award. She was recognized as a Faculty Scholar at TCU and received the First Year Generations Award at Iowa State. The Rock Island Rotary also acknowledged Kate with the RI Rotary Award for Academic Achievement. In the fall she will be attending the University of Notre Dame and majoring in Preprofessional Health Studies.

Our 2023 Valedictorian was Quentin Fonseca. Quentin is an Illinois State Scholar, and a member of the National Honor Society. He is a member of ICTM, received IHSA All-State Academic Team Nominee, and Fall and Spring WB6 All-Academic Awards He received the President's Outstanding Academic Excellence Award, Excellence in Foreign Language - Spanish Studies, and Recognition from Alleman Faculty for Theology, Literature, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Spanish. He is also the recipient of the Moline Foundation D.A.R.E and University of Illinois Presidential Scholarships as well as the Mary Little Deere-Fort Armstrong Chapter Daughter's of American Revolution Award.
